Our Environmental Policy

Golden Rose Bed & Breakfast is committed to protecting the environment, the health and safety of our employees, and the community in which we conduct our business. It is our policy to seek improvements throughout our business operations to lessen our impact on the local and global environment by conserving energy, water, and other natural resources; reducing waste generation; recycling and purchasing recycled products; and reducing our use of toxic materials. We are committed to pollution prevention, continual improvement and meeting or exceeding all environmental regulatory requirements.

To help preserve Vermont's environment we are asking our guests to help. You can help by recycling and conserving energy needed for washing. All our linens are line-dried and sun-bleached. For our continental breakfast we avoid serving sugar, jam, half-n-half, and cereal in small packages. We also avoid using throw-away utensils and dishes. You will be served on antique dishes with cloth napkins. You will be able to enjoy the morning paper but you can share it at the breakfast table with your fellow guests.

Towels

We will give you new towels when you want them. Please leave your dirty towels on the floor of your closet. If you wish to use them again please leave them on the hooks of your closet.

Recycling

We recycle bottles, cans, and newspapers. Please leave them next to your wastebasket in the plastic bucket (recycled from our building project) provided or bring them down to the kitchen. We bring the recycleables to the Fast Trash Center in Bridgewater on Saturday mornings. If you buy our maple syrup in the plastic containers, we do recycle these and if you return them at your next visit we will give you a dollar off your next purchase.

Sheets

For our long term guests, we change sheets every three days. If you wish your sheets changed more often please let us know.
